<b>SUMMARY OF CLINICAL RESPONSIBILITIES</b>
I have acted as an attending physician in HIV/AIDS care at San Francisco General Hospital's Positive Health Program since 2002. This includes a five-hour weekly clinic throughout the year, and on-call duties for one week semiannually. House staff and medical students occasionally rotate through this service, whom I supervise.
In addition, I spent two months in Viet Nam in 2005 as a clinical consultant for Harvard University, advising the Centers for Disease Control on antiretroviral rollout through the President's Emergency Program for AIDS Relief. This involved providing didactic training and clinical mentoring to 10 physicians at six clinics in Ho Chi Minh City and An Giang Province. I also engage in clinical trainings of physicians in Southeast Asia through the International Training and Education Center on HIV/AIDS (ITECH).
Beginning Oct 2006, I spend time each week as part of the HIV faculty of the UCSF Correctional Medicine

Consultation Network, providing clinical training, mentoring, and consultation to physicians providing care in California's correctional facilities. My responsibilities also include chart reviews, telemedicine, and consultation.

### CURRENT RESEARCH INTERESTS

**Epidemiological and Behavioral HIV/AIDS research.** I designed and wrote a research grant as co-Principal Investigator with Dr. Frank Wong as the Principal Investigator of record. This multi-year study is a collaborative, community-based effort with seven community partners in five U.S. cities to study HIV prevalence, incidence, and behavioral correlates among 2,000 Asian and Pacific Islander men who have sex with men. Additional testing include: CD4/CD8 count, HIV viral load, and HIV clade analysis, in order to understand the spectrum of disease in undiagnosed individuals and to understand the molecular epidemiology of HIV in this population. My support is through a subcontract with Dr. Wong's institution, Georgetown University. The five year RO1 grant has been awarded a total of \$2.2 million towards testing and project costs, researcher effort, and community partner and research subject reimbursements by the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development.

Dr. Wong and I are also writing on a manuscript from an existing RO1 grant that has collected data on 400 Southeast Asian refugees. This paper examines health services utilization and substance abuse in this population. Related to this work, I have written two manuscripts with Dr. Kyung-Hee Choi on the correlates of HIV testing in Asian and Pacific Islander men who have sex with men. We are undertaking a third manuscript using multilevel analysis to examine the structural correlates of HIV testing and another focused on knowledge of sexual partners' HIV status. I received a grant from the Academy for Educational Development to analyze and write two papers

related to HIV sexual risk among Latino men who have sex with men. Along with Dr. George Ayala, a co-investigator, I am examining: (1) the contribution of HIV stigma and socioeconomic status to HIV risk, and (2) HIV testing patterns and correlates.

I intend to extend this work on the impact of various sociocultural and structural conditions and resiliency factors that increase HIV related risk or enable reduction of harm to novel international settings (Viet Nam). In addition, based on the initial findings of my domestic study I will conduct in-depth studies of the context of seroconversion among the domestic population of at-risk men in the U.S. in order to eventually develop prevention interventions that are highly tailored and culturally specific. This work will begin with a sub-study of the HIV+ study population.

Beginning October 2006, I will serve as director of research within the UCSF Correctional Medicine Consultation Network, developing research protocols around barriers to accessing care, health disparities, patient satisfaction, and predictors of general health outcomes in California's prison system.

**HIV Clinical Research.** I authored a manuscript in preparation for submission, that arose from the MPH thesis at UC Berkeley. This paper is a systematic literature review on the efficacy of initiating antiretroviral treatment in patients hospitalized with an acute AIDS-defining illness.

**Program Monitoring and Evaluation.** I will take a major role in the program monitoring and evaluation of the UCSF Correctional Medicine Consultation Network's activities, including process and outcomes-based evaluations of clinical mentoring & consultation, clinical systems changes, and policy level impacts.
